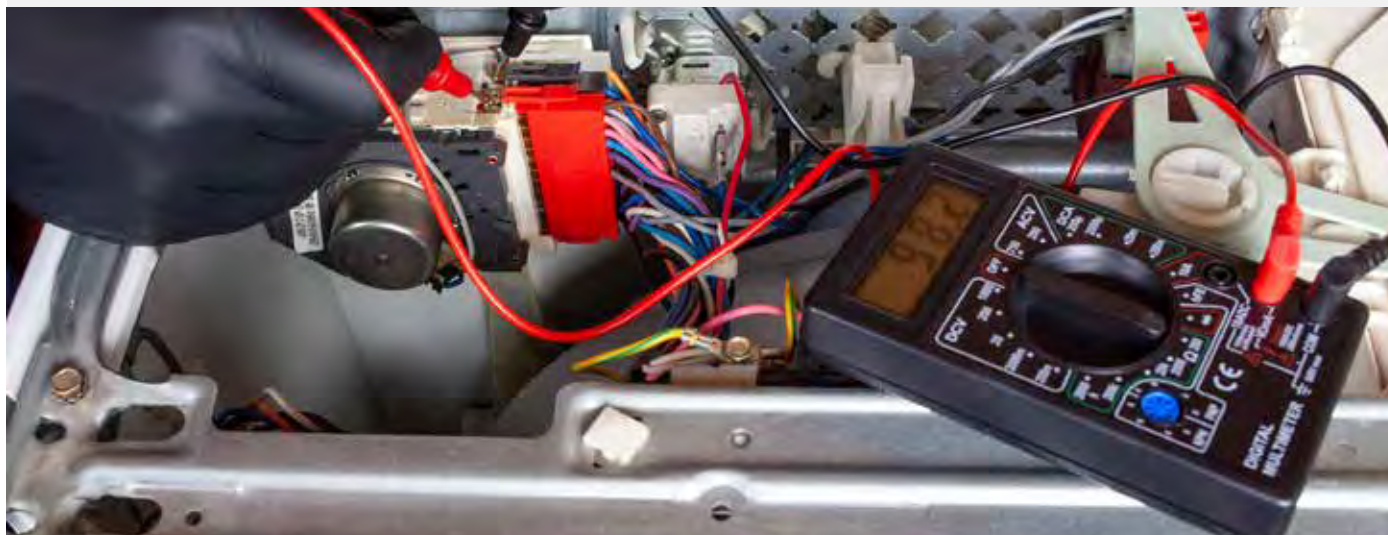

- You only do units that are new and challenging. You don't do units in which you have proven experience.
